Each day we may be encouraged to choose an act such as inviting someone for a coffee, clear out a cupboard and take something to a charity shop or write a card to someone you want to encourage. According to the Generosity Report, those who give joyfully experience deep emotional and spiritual rewards, as well as strengthened ties with friends, family and community.
